

## TAM Requirements

- Each state DOT is now required to have an asset management plan for the National Highway System (NHS).
  - Answers questions like: What do we have? What condition is it in? and How do we plan to manage it to get the most life at the least cost?
- We're required to plan for the entire NHS, including pavements and bridges owned by local agencies.
  - Since the DOT doesn't directly manage or invest in those, we point to our support for IPMP and local data collection to show good stewardship.
- MPOs are required to show how they're supporting the State's TAMP.





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## **TAMP Status**

- Iowa DOT has completed two TAM Plans, one pre-dating the FHWA requirements (2016) and the second intended to meet the "Initial" TAM Plan FHWA requirements.
- Currently working on our "Full" TAMP, which has additional requirements for Life Cycle Planning, Financial Planning, and Risk Management. Due June, 2019.
- We are required to show consistency of STIP with TAM Plan. Working on how we'll do that.

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## Other TAM Updates

- Required to review all public roads for cases where the same location has had repeated repairs using federal dollars (23 CFR 667).
  - Must complete this evaluation by November, 2020.
